

## Poll: 2001 terror attacks still haunt NYC

NEW YORK (UPI) -- Nearly 25 percent of New Yorkers say they think about the September 11, 2001, terrorist attack on the World Trade Center every day, a poll released Monday reveals.

More than one-third of city residents and half of those in the suburbs said they knew someone killed on the infamous day, the New York Daily News/Siena College survey indicated.

Half of the respondents said they planned to observe the upcoming 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 9/11 and half also retain a lingering fear that terrorists could strike again.

The *Daily News* said the findings were fairly consistent across various demographics. The 35-and-under age group appeared the least affected by the tragedy because many of the respondents were children then.

The poll of 434 New Yorkers was conducted June 5-8.
